

# The BBC Mambra Mamer Charter

The players, but also the officials (coaches and committee members) and the players' parents all have the same mission and duty to represent our club with dignity, both on and off the field.

The passion and challenge that sometimes prevails in some competitions must not detract from the fundamental vocation of sport, which remains "the spirit of pleasure in and through play in a context of camaraderie and constant friendship".

Basketball is a wonderful team sport. However, this sport requires a significant physical and psychological commitment. This is why every player must comply with the following 4 principles:

- Attendance - both at training and during games
- Loyalty - to teammates and the club
- Respect - for the sport, coaches, teammates, opponents, referees
- Team spirit - focus on the group's interest rather than its own

## The players

Players must attend all training sessions, games and tournaments, unless they are excused. Players should report conflicts as soon as possible.

In addition, we require that all players treat all teammates, opponents, referees with politeness and respect and respect for the premises, facilities and equipment.

## The parents

Parents can play a positive role in their child's development through their attitude and support. Our basketball club is not a daycare for children. It is important that parents get involved and support the club by taking over the scoreboard or Digibou duties at games, washing the team's jerseys and being present at their child's games and at events.

As a parent, you are:

- Driver - Be a reliable driver for your child (and friends). Bring them to training and games on time.
- Educator - Be an inspiration. Teach your child to take responsibility for his or her play and avoid finding excuses if things don't go his or her way. Encourage them to talk directly to coaches about the concerns of the team and individuals.
- Cheerleader - Support your child and his or her teammates in a positive way. Use positive language and do not shout technical or tactical messages. Respect the opponents and the referee and do not respond to provocations from the opposing team.

We demand that parents trust the club. They do not interfere with the work of the coaches and the committee. They have the right to ask questions they consider useful for their child's good practice and to give their feedback. The committee is always open to input of both players and parents.
